FGM also known as female genital cutting and female circumcision, is the ritual cutting or removal of some or all, of the external female genitalia. The practice is rooted in gender inequality, attempts to control women's sexuality, and ideas about purity.

Fatima's story

Fatima lives in Somalia with her family where she attends a school nearby. Her mother is a seamstress. Fatima, at 6 years of age, had a visit from her grandmother. All was pre-arranged and Fatima didn't know what was happening. 'They held my shoulders and knees, and I started crying and trying to close my legs. It was very terrible. I can never forget that. I was at home for seven days with acute pain in the area they cut. Don't do this to your daughters.' (Source: www.unicef.org/somalia)



DAY FIVE: November 29th Cyber Bullying

Flora's Story

Flora's cousin, who had been harassing her with threats of physical violence if she did not consent to marry him, pinned her down, taking compromising photos which he stored on a USB drive. Despite his threats of physical violence, Flora filed a legal case against him for intimidation. He threatened to circulate the illicit photos via mobile phone to his friends if she did not drop the battle. He carried through on his threat when she continued to push her case. (guardian.com - Aug. 2017)

In Flora's country, there are few avenues for women like her to seek support. Violence against women is increasingly connected to online forms of abuse that include blackmail.

DAY 7: December 1st Harassment and Violence in the Work Place

Sarah's Story

"I work in an office. The good days are those when other employees ask you if you're single and why "a pretty girl like you should be alone". The not so good days are the ones where they feel free to touch you, a hand on your arm, an unwanted hug, a pat on the bum." (Irish Independent Nov.4, 2017)

Women and men experience violence and harassment in the world of work, but unequal status and power relations in society and at work often result in women being far more exposed to such treatment.

High Risk Groups

- **1. Migrant workers**: More than half are women, but they comprise 98% of sex-trafficked victims. Often, they are in isolated and invisible "women's work" with higher violence risk.
- **2. Domestic workers:** are usually female, often doing informal work, without a support system. They can undergo physical or psychological violence, including sexual harassment and rape.
- **3. Health services workers**, between 80-90% are women. They are eight times more likely to face physical threats, than those working in manufacturing.

Women in Management: It has been proved that women who reach executive positions, may face high levels of sexual harassment.



Global Fact: 235 million women work in countries where there is no legal protection against workplace harassment. In these situations, women are more vulnerable if there is a male dominated management unless there is a clear, legal framework.

- Provisions to prevent gender based violence at work
- Measures to protect and support workers affected by gender based violence
- A description of groups most affected by gender based violence: LGBT, Indigenous and migrant workers, workers living with HIV/AIDS and disabilities, people trapped in forced and child labour

Girls Deprived of Education

Education is a human right regardless of your gender. According to UNICEF, "When we educate a girl, we not only give her the tools and knowledge to make her own decisions and shape her own future, we also help raise the standard of living of her family and her community."

Anya's Story

Anya had worked in a factory for two years when she heard that she could learn to read and write in a literacy programme being held after work. She realised that as a child, she had been sent to the big city to work in a factory to earn money, so that her brothers could attend school. When Anya became literate, she spoke about how she had felt ashamed because she had never gone to school. Anya tried to hide this from her companions at work. The literacy programme was very freeing. Anya no longer felt ashamed because now she could read and write and could join in with her companions at work. (As told to the writer)

Mara's Story

Mara lived in Moldova where it was difficult to find work. She heard there were great opportunities in Western Europe so jumped at the offer of a job in a bar. Mara quickly realised that she had been deceived and was now a victim of trafficking. She was bought and sold by traffickers who took her through Albania, Italy, France and England before she arrived in Ireland. Here her passport and papers were taken from her and destroyed, and she was put to work in a brothel. Mara had to work all day and frequently into the night, receiving only food and shelter. If she did not obey, Mara was told her family in Moldova would be killed. Mara managed to escape and got help. (Shared with permission)

DAY TEN: 4th December

`Rape as a Weapon of War '.

We knew the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA) was nearby, but it was shocking to see them arrive and brutally round up the men and boys in our village. One of the leaders an older man, pointed at me, then two soldiers approached and roughly lifted me up and locked me in the back of a jeep. I was just 15. For the next seven years I was one of this leader's six 'wives', cooking, cleaning and constantly moving from place to place. I had two children with him. It was only when the Ugandan army ambushed our LRA camp that I was rescued.... (As heard by the writer at the UN in Geneva)

Widows and Property

Some traditional cultures do not easily concede recognition of a widow's human rights. In practice, especially in some rural areas, it is still widely assumed that only men should own or inherit land, that widowhood terminates a woman's social legitimacy.

Michelle's Story

When Michelle, 57, was widowed in 2012, she lost more than her husband. Shortly after his death, her in-laws took over the fields she had tilled for decades. They also stole fruit from the trees in her kitchen garden and sold the harvest, leaving her without any livelihood. They further intimidated and insulted her by surrounding her and attempting to chase her away.

Michelle's neighbours advised her that the *Legal Resources Foundation* could help her to protect her inheritance. When this legal aid organisation took the matter to court and Michelle obtained restraining orders against her in-laws, she was able to go back to tilling her fields. But her in-laws continue to threaten her, so she still worries about the future: "*I am fearful and my heart is unsettled.*"

Aregash's Story

"A woman's life is hard, and climate change is making it harder," says Aregash, a 32-year-old Ethiopian woman who lives with her six children in a small farming community. "Because of changing rainfall patterns, crop yields are suffering, and my family doesn't have enough food. We used to get 500 to 600 kilos per harvest, but now we can barely get 100. It has never been like this. The only way we can raise our kids is from the land and if it fails to produce, there isn't enough to feed them..." 
Day 13: December 7th - Femicide

Femicide is a sex-based, hate crime term, broadly defined as "the intentional killing of women or girls because they are females."

Ana Clara's Story

Ana Clara was thirty and lived on the periphery of Porto Alegre, Brazil. She was in a relationship with a partner for six years and had one daughter. The relationship was very unstable and there was a lot of conflict and violence which resulted in repeated break-ups. On New Year's Eve 2007, Ana Clara was stabbed to death by her partner. (Femicide: Narratives of Gender Crimes: SN Meneghel - 2013)



Ownership & Objectification of Women

Women frequently face sexual objectification in daily interpersonal interactions and through the active and passive consumption of multimedia. This can lead to internalization of society's scrutiny, resulting in habitual body monitoring and self-consciousness. In turn it can increase feelings of body shame and appearance anxiety. Laura's story

'I was the victim of a crime as a teenager, at the hands of a man who sexually abused me for several years. When I eventually told people about the abuse, some who were close to the abuser chose not to believe me. "Why didn't you fight him?" they asked. "Why didn't you scream? You've always been so outspoken - if it really happened you would have told us earlier!" I was branded a liar, labelled mentally unstable, and told I had got it all wrong. A Gift or an Abuse of Human Rights?



As I reflected I began to get angry. Why should women and girls have to spend so many hours fetching water, because the government chooses to spend money on other things? The UN has confirmed that water is a basic human right, yet access is denied to millions, in many countries...

Article 14 Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries, asylum from persecution.

The International Bill of Rights is the UDHR with the two International Covenants:

- a) Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) and
- **b)** Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR), which develop the articles in the UDHR. They are therefore binding covenants. Countries report to the UN their progress on HR and other Covenants.



December 10th 1948-2018 marks 70 Years of the UN Declaration on HR.
