

Quiet reflection on the Word of God

Catherine inspired her followers with her own love and zeal. Francis Warde, her closest companion and confidante, gives an insight into the power of Catherine's example & influence. In a letter to M. Gonzaga O'Brien in 1879 she wrote:

"You never knew her, I knew her, better than I have known anybody in my life. She was a woman of God and God made her a woman of vision. She showed what it meant to be a Sister of Mercy, to see the world and its people in terms of God's love, to love everyone who needed love, to care for everyone who needed care. Now her vision is driving me on".





The group meet regularly to pray together and share ideas about their work as Youth Mercy Associates. They also enjoy participating in many leisure activities and outings.




