

## Notes For Ministers

### Ritual Space

If possible, arrange the chairs in a circle (or a shape that the people are facing others)  
Create a central space, if possible, for the elements that will be brought forward.

### Water Rite

If possible, have a significant water “container” in a place people will be able to gather in twos or more. If possible, the water brought into the ritual space during the **Opening Rite** could be slowly poured into this container at the beginning of the Water Ritual.

**Blessing:** The ritual gesture of blessing is to extend both hands. The leader could model this by extending both hands – thus having someone hold the book.

## Opening Rite

### Call to Prayer:

**Ringing of a prayer gong or bell (3 times)**

### Dance of the Elements:

**During the Opening Refrain, various elements will be danced into our presence ... a globe, chimes, fire, water, and anything else that reminds the local community of its environment. It may be appropriate to remain seated.**

### Refrain During the Dance:

**Continue to sing the refrain until all of the elements are placed**

Reflections from the *Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops*, Mary Robinson, and Pope Francis:

As Pope Francis says:

“Polluting or destroying the environment is like telling God  
one does not like what God created and proclaimed to be good.”
