Leader: The Wairua of Mercy calls us into the Year of Mercy.

E te Atua Atawhai we ask you to bless this door

(Bless the door – water and greenery)

Leader: Uakina te Kūaha o te Atawhai! Throw open the Door of Mercy.

All Respond: Me whakamoemiti tātou ki te Ariki! Let us give thanks to our God.

Leader: Let us now enter into the grace of this jubilee year singing: Bring Forth the Kingdom by Marty Haugen

1. You are salt for the earth, O people: Salt for the Kingdom of God! Shine the flavour of life, O people: Life in the Kingdom of God. *Refrain:*

Bring forth the Kingdom of mercy, Bring forth the Kingdom of peace, Bring forth the Kingdom of justice, Bring forth the city of God.

- 2. You are a light on the hill, O people: Light for the City of God! Shine so holy and bright, O people: Shine for the Kingdom of God.
- 3. You are a seed of the Word, O people: Bring forth the Kingdom of God! Seeds of mercy and seeds of justice, Grow in the Kingdom of God!
- 4. We are a blest and a pilgrim people: Bound for the Kingdom of God. Love our journey and love our homeland: Love is the Kingdom of God!

Once inside: Let us all pray together - He inoi tatou

As we enter into this Year of Mercy, bless the 'doors' of our hearts that we may be open to the call of mercy and hear both the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor. LS #49

Surround us with mercy – a wellspring of joy, serenity and peace. MV #2 With gratitude, we enter into this significant moment in our time. Amen.

Leader: Pope Francis announced the Year of Mercy in April of this year with *Misericordiae Vultus*. In June he set before us his encyclical letter, *Laudato Si' On Care of our Common Home*.

Let us listen to his vision for this Year of Mercy from these two documents.

Refrain following each statement: Teach me Your Ways by Frank Andersen
Akona mai, Ki te ara tika, Akona mai Matou, E te Ariki
Teach me your ways, Walk me in your pathways, Teach me your ways O Lord, For you are my God

- 1. How much I desire that the year to come will be steeped in mercy, so that we can go out to every man and woman, bringing the goodness and tenderness of God! (MV#5) **Refrain...**
- 2. In this Holy Year, we look forward to the experience of opening our hearts to those living on the outermost fringes of society; fringes which modern society itself creates. (MV#15) *Refrain...*
- 3. During this Jubilee, the Church will be called even more to heal the wounds of *the Earth and ...the poor**, to soothe them with the oil of consolation, to bind them with mercy and cure them with solidarity and vigilant care. (MV#15 *LS #49)

- 4. The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change. The Creator does not abandon us... Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home. (LS#13) *Refrain...*
- 5. Human life is grounded in three fundamental and closely intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbour and with the earth itself. (LS#66) *Refrain.*.
- 6. Because all creatures are connected, each must be cherished with love and respect, for all of us as living creatures are dependent on one another. (LS#42) *Refrain...*

Leader: In *Misericordiae Vultus* Pope Francis calls us to be merciful as God is merciful. He reminds us that in the Gospels, "Jesus of Nazareth by his words, his actions, and his entire person reveals the mercy of God". (MV#1)

Reflection

The Circle of Mercy Prayer

Leader: In this Year of Mercy we are invited to atawhai mai atawhai atu - to receive Mercy from God who is merciful, to offer this Mercy, indeed to be Mercy in response to the cry of the Earth and the cry of the Poor. In the 44 countries where Sisters of Mercy and companions work, we are invited to light a candle and to pray Pope Francis' Prayer for our Earth and her peoples. In each country between noon and 2 pm, Sisters and companions around the world will pray this prayer, wrapping Earth in prayer for 24 hours. *(The candle is lit))*

Let us stand and pray the *Prayer for our Earth from Laudato SI'*.
