#### **Renewal Programme Core Staff**

**Áine Barrins rsm** is a member of the Western Province of The Congregation in Ireland. Her early years in ministry were in second level education. Since the nineties Áine has been ministering in the area of spirituality. She has devoted the last eleven years to making Catherine known and loved and has given workshops and retreats based on Catherine's life and spirituality throughout Ireland, Great Britain, Australia and Aoteoroa New Zealand. Áine will be the facilitator/spiritual guide for the full month programme.

**Ann Brady rsm & Paula Carron rsm** have been offering Capacitar workshops in Trauma Healing for Catholic and Protestant groups involved in victims' rights, reconciliation and peace efforts in Northern Ireland since 2003. They have also conducted training sessions with participants working with schools, mental health and trauma centres, prisoners and victims' groups, women's groups, family centres, and those affected by the years of the Troubles. Both currently serve on the provincial leadership team for the Northern Province of The Congregation in Ireland.

**Mary Conway rsm** is a Sister of Mercy from the North of Ireland. She began her working career as a teacher of physical education and mathematics before training as a family therapist at Santa Clara University, California. Mary has worked as a therapist, yoga teacher and mindfulness teacher at the Aisling Centre, Enniskillen. She currently serves on the provincial leadership team for the Northern Province of The Congregation in Ireland.

**Helena O'Donoghue rsm** belongs to the South Central Province of The Congregation in Ireland. A former secondary school teacher and principal, she has worked in community development, retreat work, spirituality, chapters and has written widely on religious topics. She served in Leadership at Congregational and Provincial levels (1985-2007) and was President of the Conference of Religious in Ireland (1999-2002). Currently she is engaged with transition matters in healthcare and education, as well as spirituality work and social action for people affected by homelessness.

**Anne Reid**, a native of Ireland, is an Associate with the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas. She has been involved in the ministry of Mercy International Centre since 1994. Anne is the author of *Daring to be Different - The life of Catherine Elizabeth McAuley. Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy*, which is a story of Catherine written in a way to appeal to young people and those young at heart. She is also the narrator for several Mercy resources including *A Pictorial Tour of Catherine McAuley's House of Mercy* and *Your Ever Affectionate, M.C. McAuley*.

**Mary Reynolds rsm** is the Executive Director of Mercy International Association (MIA). In this capacity Mary leads, integrates, develops and manages Mercy International Association in accordance with the MIA Vision.

**Lily Sexton rsm** is a member of the Northern Province of The Congregation in Ireland. She is a native of Cavan and trained as a teacher. She has spent the last 9 years focussed in the area of Healing. Lily is very committed to Wellbeing and passionate about helping people live life to the full.

**Johann M. Vento, Ph.D.** is Professor of Religious Studies and Theology at Sisters of Mercy sponsored Georgian Court University in Lakewood, New Jersey, USA. Her primary research interests are political theology and mercy, praxis theory and spiritual formation; violence, trauma, and healing; and inter-religious dialogue. She has collaborated with many others in the Mercy world to create an online certificate in Mercy Spirituality. She has published articles in *Horizons, Teaching Theology and Religion, Jnanadeepa: Pune Journal of Religious Studies,* and in several edited volumes. She lives in Ramsey, NJ with her husband Michael and their two children, Mira and Samuel.
