who lives trustingly beside you.

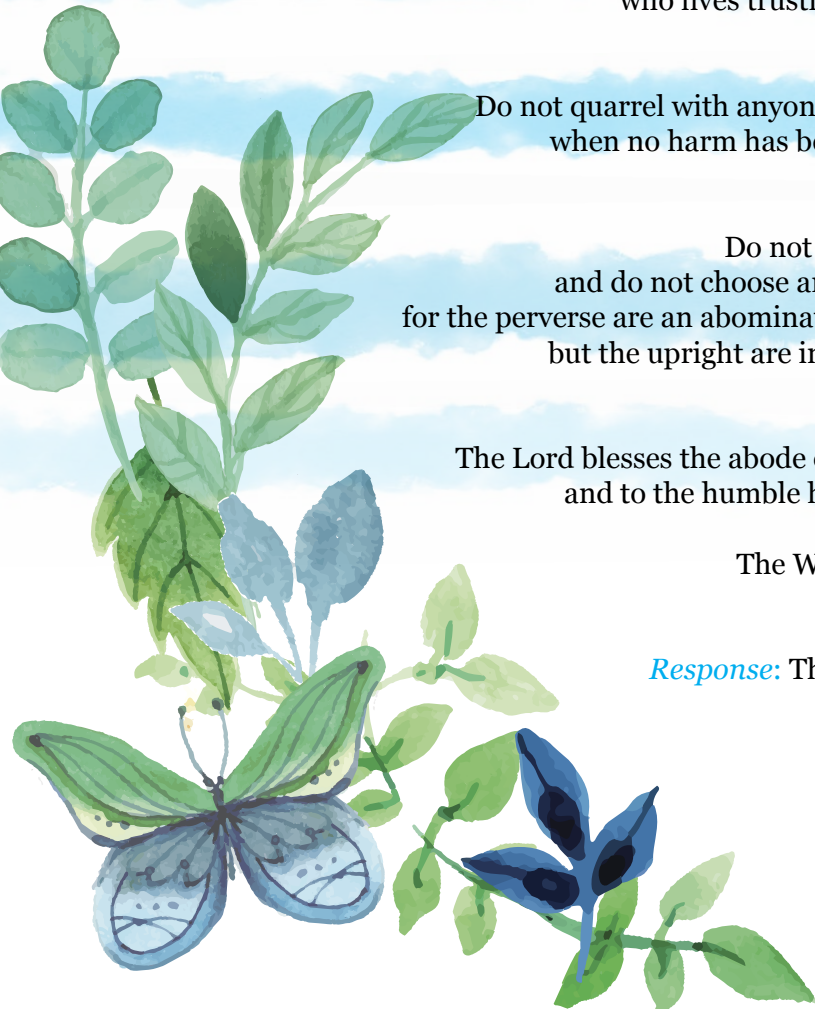
