Caritas Australia has now committed \$1,000,000 to support the international Caritas network's multi-million dollar pledge to help communities affected by this devastating crisis with emergency aid and longer term relief.

Our network partners, CRS (Caritas USA) and Caritas Philippines, are working in close coordination and are prioritising emergency shelter, water and sanitation, household relief items (blankets, kitchen items, cookware), potable water and toilets. Initial relief efforts will help at least 18,000 families and include:

- 18,000 tarpaulins for emergency use
- 1 million water purification tablets to ensure access to safe, clean drinking water
- 18,000 emergency shelter supply kits
- 5,000 water, sanitation and hygiene kits
- 5,000 non-food item kits
